Dear Parent/Carer,

The children have worked incredibly hard over the past term and had lots of fun too! The Christmas holidays are here and it's time to reflect on the past term – and what a term it's been! Nursery

The Nursery children have had a brilliant first term at Ribbon. During our family sessions, they have explored a range of core texts that have helped develop their story telling skills, expanding their vocabulary, and honing their listening and attention skills. The children have also enjoyed learning a range of new songs and rhymes and, have worked hard to develop their early phonics skills by hearing the syllables and initial sounds in words. The children have also used their fine and gross motor skills to mark make in all areas. They particularly enjoyed using the large chalk and paint brushes to mark make outside on the ground and the walls. Meanwhile, in the Den, the children explored a plethora of arts and

crafts, ranging from transient, moveable artwork to intricate cutting and collaging. Teamwork and cooperation flourished as the children wielded tools with care, showcasing a delightful exchange of vocabulary during these imaginative experiences. The Construction Area saw the children collaboratively fashioning bridges and ramps, conducting exhilarating tests to gauge the speed of cars based on ramp height. Over in the Small World Area, a symphony of laughter echoed as the children fashioned appropriate environments for their animal companions,

engaging in thoughtful discussions about where these creatures might reside—be it the forest, jungle, or farm. Their conversations seamlessly wove in real-life experiences, adding depth to their imaginative activities. Outdoors, a journey into the natural world unfolded as the children harnessed the wonders of their surroundings, fashioning numbers, letters and shapes from leaves and painting pictures with sticks and flowers. Their imaginations took them on journeys as pirates and even monsters! Fridays brought excitement as the children ventured into the forest, embarking on thrilling forest expeditions, eagerly delving into the wonders of their curiosity and spark their sense of exploration. Reception



It has been a very busy term in Reception. The children have had lots of opportunities to discover, explore, and gain valuable experiences in a wide range of contexts. They have read lots of exciting stories which have opened lines of enquiry for learning including: 'Owl Babies' where the children explored their feelings about starting Reception and leaving their grown up at home for a full day, 'Handa's Surprise' where the children learned about different cultures, during Black History Month. In the lead up to Halloween, the children read 'Room on the Broom' and were inspired to make different potions and spells. The children continue to enjoy their weekly visits to

both the Ribbon Forest and Murton Library. They have become much more confident in risk taking and assessing situations to decide if it's a safe choice to make. The children have really enjoyed exploring the forest and the Early Years outdoor area, in all weathers! They especially enjoyed the recent snowfall working together as a team to make the best snowmen and igloos. At the Ribbon Forest, the children learn about the world around them and have enjoyed finding bugs and insects in the undergrowth. Learning in a variety of environments promotes independence, organisation, problem solving, communication and teamwork skills.

Year 1



This term, we welcomed Terry, the Community Champion, from Asda in Seaham to support the children with DT learning. The children had previously designed their fruit kebabs in school and had the chance to make them with Terry. The children have also been exploring the school grounds to help support their learning in the classroom. This helped the children develop their understanding of the size of the school grounds, ophenes.

Year 2

The children followed the route on their map brilliantly and could explain where they were located at different points. The next visit took the children to Durham Cathedral, which linked with our RE topic about St. Cuthbert. The children learned about St. Cuthbert's links with Durham Cathedral and his importance to Christianity in our region. A brilliant day was had by all with lots of new knowledge about this famous saint. As part of our History topic about the Great Fire of London, we travelled to Newcastle to learn about the Great Fire of Gateshead at the fascinating Discovery Museum. Finally, it was Year 2's turn to visit the cinema at Dalton Park for a special festive treat.

Year 3

In September, specialists from Wilderness Outdoor Education visited school and everyone took part in a 'Stone Age Survival' workshop. The children became hunter gatherers finding out how people in the Stone Age made fires to keep warm and cook food. The children also built shelters to protect them from the elements. Later in the term, Year 3 visited Rainton Meadows Nature

Reserve in Houghton-le-Spring to deepen their learning about animals and humans in science. They completed workshops including pond dipping, mini beast hunting and a wildlife orienteering challenge. Our last trip of the term was a Geography field trip looking at land use in Murton. The children

navigated their way around the village using a map. They were able to identify lots of different uses of land and finished at the Cenotaph admiring its newest addition – 'Children of Mothers'.

Year 4 also took part in a 'Romans on The Tyne' workshop, led by a team of experts from Newcastle University. This hanced learning about the Romans. The children explored a huge variety

afternoon on the beach creating their own model versions of the River Tees – just wow! The highlight of the term was performing in front of family and friends at the Christmas concerts. The children sang beautifully and played instruments with such confidence – they are all superstars! What a productive term Year 5 have had! The children can't wait to see what spring brings.

Year 6

What a busy term - what excitement lies ahead in Spring?! This will be the last Spring term at Ribbon for our Year 6 children!
